APPROVAL OF APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION WITHOUT EXAMINATION FOR MEDICAL LABORATORY TECHNICIAN

WHEREAS, Section 21 (3)¹ of **Republic Act (R.A.) No. 5527**, also known as the **"Philippine Medical Technology Act of 1969"**, as amended, states that the Professional Regulatory Board of Medical Technology (Board) shall issue a certificate of registration as medical laboratory technician without examination;
