Number of institutions and establishments where professionals are employed that are inspected and monitored		325	300	290	255	1170	0	0	0		0		With the difficulty in conducting physical inspections due to imposed travel restrictions and quarantine protocols in the country, all scheduled inspection and monitoring of the various Professional Regulatory Boards were cancelled pursuant to Memorandum No. 17 s. 2020. The Commission is currently drafting guidelines on the conduct of inspection and monitoring of higher education institutions/establishments with integrated procedure on the use of virtual platforms. While resort to virtual inspection is an option, there are limitations inherent in this type of inspection. For instance, air/gas and odor emissions in factories, plants, or similar establishments are best observed and assessed thru physical rather than virtual inspection. To address this and the other identified limitations of "pure' virtual inspection, the revised guidelines also proposes to include a blended type of inspection (combined physical and virtual). Since the blended type will still involve the physical deployment of personnel (other than the Board Members) on the site of inspection, there are health and safety issues that need to be carefully looked into. These are the remaining items that are being reviewed so that the revised inspection guidelines can be finally issued and implemented by the PRC.
